Primary School News

Primary Sports Highlights

We've had an extremely busy past couple of weeks with students involved in a host of activities and sports during and after school. This weekend for example, saw our gymnasts feature prominently at Mashrek International School where they competed against a number of other schools and clubs. Our children were amazing! And that is by no means an exaggeration. Earlier in the week, our Grade 3-5 Athletics Team competed at Amman Baccalaureate School, distinguishing themselves with their results and positive attitudes.

Holy Bible Competition

Over the past two weeks, our Religion Department has also been busy with competitions. The 5th Bible Competition took place on April 2nd and featured a number of our Grade 4 & 5 students. The main purpose was to familiarise students with reading from the Holy Bible and memorising verses in order to deepen Christian concepts and apply them to their practical lives. The contest included memorising 22 verses from the Bible. Students were also asked a series of questions related to Lent and concepts related to Christianity. The judging panel was hosted by the Bible Society - Jordan which uses international standards in judging the competition. The performance of the students in this competition was outstanding and all of the participants were given certificates of appreciation and awards.

Holy Quran Competition

The 7th Holy Quran competition was held on April 10th with 59 participants from G1 – G5. All of our Muslim students were encouraged to participate in the competition and students were divided into seven levels according to their memorisation skills. Students were encouraged to reflect upon the suras they had memorised and make links to their daily lives and values featured in the Holy Quran. The performance of the Primary students during the competition was incredible and the way in which they recited their suras was especially moving. A number of children were even competitive against their Secondary peers. Our judges, Ms Hebah Hatahet (licensed from the Muslim World League and the Ministry of Awqaf) and Mr Yaser Tadmuri (lecturer at the Ministry of Awqaf) were especially impressed by the organisation, performance and commitment of our students and their families.

G1 & G3 Assemblies

Congratulations to Grade 1 Madeline and Grade 3 Sheena who have hosted our recent assemblies. Ms Madeline's class provided us with an amazing rendition of the *The Gruffalo* while Ms Sheena's class unpacked learning that has taken place through our Second Step character education programme.
