Secondary School News

Dear Parents,

We really enjoyed the first week back at school. There was a very positive feeling around campus as we all swapped holiday stories. I hope your children enjoyed it as much as we did. The rhythm of school came quickly, and we are looking forward to some productive days in the short week ahead.

Some of our students had a busy weekend receiving extensive training from Ms. Liz, our School Counsellor, on being a Peer Helper for this year. The Peer Helpers are a great asset to IAA as they help students build and maintain connections with their peers. They do this by listening to those who are struggling with problems or difficult circumstances and by resolving student conflicts collaboratively. We thank our Peer Helpers for their commitment in fostering feelings of belonging and acceptance that will only enhance our school climate.

We are also looking forward to the elections for the Student Representative Council. We start this week with the Head Boy and Head Girl. We are pleased with the enthusiasm from Grade 11 who want to get involved, and

they will be presenting their speeches to the school during PSHE this week. As well as their elections this week, we are taking in nominations for the Class Reps in each grade and these will be elected when we get back from the Eid break.

We do seem to have started the year at pace. A number of our students are shortly going to overseas swimming tournaments, and we wish them all the very best. We introduce our overseas trips in this second week, so parents can get some idea of what is on offer in case they want to plan. This year we are confirmed to have:

- Theatre Trip (December) London and open to Grades 9 to 11
- Ramallah MUN (January) invited senior MUN students
- International Action Trip to Nepal (February) open to Grade 11
- Spain Trip (April/May) open Grades 8 and 9 students taking Spanish

In addition, there are a number of sports trips that will be overseas this year, and they are currently being finalized. More details will follow.

Auditions: Our auditions for the annual Musical, *Into the Woods*, will start shortly (open to students in grades 6 to 11). Information will be available in posters around the school and in the student bulletin. We anticipate demand for places will be high, so it is important for students to sign up for auditions before the deadline given on the posters. Students can also help out with behind the scenes – choreography, costume, makeup, lighting and props.

Hawks try-outs: They have started, and posters are around school. The schedule is on Moodle and tutors are letting students know in morning registration. It is important that students wishing to be considered for our teams attend the sessions they are interested in.

Activities: We will begin introducing other afterschool activities to students shortly and anticipate writing to parents about them shortly after the Eid break.

MUN: For Grade 8 students who are interested in MUN, it is important that they register with Mr Phil (preferably this week). For Grades 9 to 11 students interested in participating in the first local MUN, again it is important that they register for the RNESMUN with Mr Phil this week. We ask our parents to encourage their children to participate as it is a great opportunity to research current issues and to debate and negotiate such issues in a cooperative and diplomatic manner.

The Grade 9 students have the option to either study the “Discrete Sciences” or “Integrated Sciences”. If Grade 9 students want to change their subject package, they must collect the “subject choice” form from the Secondary Receptionist. The form must be signed by parents and handed back to the receptionist before any changes can be made. Grade 9 students have until September 14th to change their subject package. However, please note that some changes may not be approved as some classes have reached their maximum capacity.

Homework helps our students consolidate their learning, maximize their progress and achieve their potential. The homework set by our teachers should be meaningful, linking to the objectives of the subject and challenging. Students are not expected to exceed the following maximum of time allocation per school week night completing out-of-class work: Grades 6-7: 1 hour; Grade 8: 1.5 hours; Grade 9: 2 hours and Grades 10-11: 2.5 hours. Under the student-parent tab of Moodle, the homework timetables have been posted for grades 6 to 8.

We are starting our MYP seminars for parents this week and I would urge you to attend if you want to learn more about the nature of our programme in Grades 6 to 10. On Monday we have an overview of the MYP and

then on Tuesday the first of the subject specific talks as we address Languages in the MYP. Both start at 8.00 in the Theatre.

We would like to thank the PTA in advance for hosting Eid snacks for the staff on Wednesday. We are looking forward to our Eid assembly on that day. It just remains for us to wish you all a very happy and celebratory Eid break.

Library News

Summer Reading

The Summer Reading deadline is this Wednesday, 30 August. Please return all passports by then.

KG Library-Ms. Tania

The PreK and KG students have been learning how to care for their books. Early Years students benefit from this unit at the beginning of each academic year. Respecting library property is one aspect of life-long learning habits the library teaches IAA students. Hopefully, this lesson will transfer to your homes and your children will start being attentive to their own personal libraries as well. The following are the guidelines we share in Unit 1.

When I check out a book, I take care of it by doing these things:

1. I wash my hands so they are nice and clean before touching my book.
2. I keep my pencil and colouring pencils away from my book.
3. I mark my place in a book with a bookmark. I don't bend the pages.
4. I turn the pages by using the top corners so they don't rip.
5. I always carry my book in a book bag or any other plastic bag.
6. I keep my water bottle closed tightly when I have a book in my bag.
7. I keep my book in a safe place at home.
8. I always return my books to the library on time.

Primary Library

It is going to be an exciting week because the students will be able to check out books from the library! They will be learning how to use the library and its vocabulary. Students will learn to use new words like 'check in', 'check out' and 'circulation desk'. Students will be playing library vocabulary bingo and matching words with definitions in a fun interactive way. As part of the digital citizenship unit, Grade 5 students are continuing to discuss a more serious topic: **cyberbullying**. They will learn about the differences between regular bullying and cyberbullying and also identify words such as 'target', 'upstander', and 'bystander'. They'll also generate solutions for dealing with situations they encounter online.

Media Lab – Ms. Rawan

Grade 5 began with information literacy the first week back. Ms. Rawan and Ms. Dima used Common Sense Media to help students learn the basics of cybersafety and acceptable use. The lessons were capped off by a Grade 5 session in the MPR last Thursday. Ms. Melinda and the Grade 5 Team, in addition to counselors and librarians attended to facilitate student discussion regarding these important issues.

Secondary Library-Ms. Kathleen

We've been off to a great start with DP students researching for their Extended Essays. We have such a wide assortment of topics, from politics in Venezuela to Harry Potter to vegetable encapsulation formulas for extended release/suspended release medicines. It keeps the library on its toes, to be sure. Students are using Questia, Oxford Reference, and traditional print sources to add depth and credibility to their writing.

Grades 6-9 are beginning their library rotations to check-out English books to read for a book report assignment due in 6 weeks. Students are using our new library catalog interface, Destiny Discover, to find appropriate and interesting books.

We are very pleased with our readers and the reading culture at IAA. It's going to be a wonderful year.
