They can now relax, if only for a few days (a) I suspect that all others are now working very hard to finalize the work required of them to make sure their applications are submitted before the Christmas break. The 21st December deadline is quite an important one for us at the Counselling office, particularly since G12 students will be using the break to focus on their Pre-Mock exams. The Pre- Mock grades (also known and Mid- Year grades) are crucial for universities in US and Canada whose decisions come out in Spring 2024, once they've received G12 marks.

We are now actively working with students who will be submitting a new round of applications to US universities through the Regular round. Their deadline is fast approaching - due on January 1st 2024. Starting on the 21st December our school and all higher education institutions will still be closed and will not be back at work till after that deadline. We are therefore urging our students to set time aside to work on their Supplements this week so they receive their feedback in time.
