College Counselling News

During the month of December, the work we do with G12 intensifies as we aim to finalize all university applications by the Christmas break. Please remember that the majority of application deadlines fall during the first week of January when our school will be off. It is crucial therefore that all required work is checked and approved by the Counselling Office before we go on vacation. This year our graduating class is 74 students with the majority applying to UK, Europe and Canada. As such, we have had a number of application sessions this week focusing on the Netherlands, Switzerland, Ireland and Spain. We encourage students to now finish off the applications we started, write up their essays and send through the completed work for our review. Last week we had a very busy weeks meeting with G12 parents. It was a time to discuss students' progress, university options and CVs. We have also had the pleasure of hosting Syracuse University on our campus where students from G11 and G12 attended to listen to what institution had to offer from scholarships to programs.

The coming weeks the Counselling Office will be conducting information sessions targeting G10 students and parents. The goal is to familiarize our G10s with the college application process early on to help them make informed choices when selecting their Diploma subjects as well as their respective career paths. We will also be holding a session to introduce the Unifrog platform which will be an essential tool for college counselling. Interviews for selecting Diploma subjects are scheduled to take place in January. Please keep an eye out on the dates for when these sessions will be – everyone is highly encouraged to attend.
