A Message from the Director

Dear IAA Community,

The disturbing news and horrific footage of the recent mosques' shootings in New Zealand was shocking. The video spread on social media and was available for hours after the attack, as Facebook, Twitter and YouTube scrambled to remove the violent scenes that resembled a shooter on some video game like Fortnite. As I extend my condolences to the families of those who lost their lives, my fear has grown as to how much violence our children – and us- are exposed to and the lack of internet safeguarding, thus spreading aggressiveness and anger in our society. I pray for global peace which I believe can only be achieved through finding one's inner peace, as Dalai Lama said: ***"We need to take action to develop compassion, to create inner peace within ourselves and to share that inner peace with our family and friends. Peace and warm-heartedness can then spread through the community just as ripples radiate out across the water when you drop a pebble into a pond."***

Speaking global, the IAA hosted the CIS Middle East Institute on International Admission & Guidance conference last weekend that brought together professionals from over 20 different countries. The two-day event provided a platform where participants interacted, shared and learned about education systems in the region as well as admission requirements in the US, UK, Europe and beyond.

Quite a few annual competitions coming up soon. We have the Robotics and the Bridge Building, the latter happening for the second consecutive year in Secondary. I wish all students concerned the best of luck. Also, coming up is the long-awaited The Addams Family – a musical comedy that should be a treat for the IAA community. Stay tuned to our communication channels for ticket sales.

On the trips front, I would like to restate that the new regulations of the Ministry of Education have been published, stipulating clear instructions and simultaneously banning certain sites across Jordan like forests, wetlands, wadis, adventure and challenge parks, just to name a few. Whilst challenging and limiting, we will always strive to find ways to enhance learning beyond the classroom. At the end of the day, these measures are for the safety and well-being of our children.

Finally, I will be available on Tuesday from 8-9am for the open meeting at my office for those who wish to see me.
