We are entering a very busy last 8 weeks of the academic year; it is amazing how time flies. The focus of the next few weeks is to concentrate on our current units of study and ensure that students are well prepared for their end of year assessments. More information about the end of year assessments will be released later this month.

#### G9 Bake Sale

The Grade 9 students had their bake sale last Thursday, and they sold everything they brought. The money raised from the Bake Sale will be donated to the Azmi Mufti Camp, specifically to support them in creating an indoor space for the women and their children. The money raised from the Civvies Day will go to Himmetna, a charity that is working to bring equity and dignity to health care provision in Jordan. A job well done Grade 9s!

#### **Quran Competition**

We would like to congratulate all of the Grades 6 to 11 students participating in the Quran competition. Over 30 students will be participating. It will take place on Tuesday May 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Theatre, and it will run from 9am to 12pm. Parents are welcome to attend.

#### **Earth Day Challenge**

During the holidays it was Earth Day. As part of our activities surrounding this important event we had a special lesson, as part of our "multi-age group" sessions, on how some simple diet choices can have a significant environmental impact. This week we are challenging our students (and you!) to actively pursue some environmentally friendly diet choices. Please speak to your children if you would like to know more. We also had a guest speaker, a "Sustainability Advocate", in last Thursday to speak with our Grade 9s about solid domestic waste management in Jordan. She emphasized that in addition to the 3 "R's", reduce, reuse and recycle, we need to enforce a 4<sup>th</sup> "R" – refuse...specifically refuse the use of single-use plastics.

#### **ISA Tests**

Next week we have our annual ISA diagnostic tests. These will take place on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> May. It is important that all students attend school on these days, so that we can gain the fullest data set to assess the educational progress of our students at IAA. #### **Annual Fashion Show**

Our annual fashion show takes place on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> May. The organizing committee, comprised of Grade 11 students, has been working hard to ensure that the event is a success. They have high hopes of being able to give a significant contribution to their chosen charity. #### **IB MYP Feedback**

As part of our commitment to self-assessment and ensuring that our MYP curriculum is of the highest standard, each year we voluntary offer units to the IB for them to evaluate. Our latest feedback has just arrived, and we are very pleased with the results. In particular, the IB congratulated us for the strength of our conceptual

understanding. As ever, we also received feedback on how we can strengthen aspects of our curriculum, and we are now working on ensuring these are fed into our process of continual improvement.

#### Grade 10 and 12 Final Examinations

Grade 12 have now started their final examination session. We wish them the best of luck in their endeavours. The list of university acceptances this year is very broad indeed, with some excellent scholarships being awarded and an increase in European universities attracting IAA students. Grade 12s will complete their final exam on the 19<sup>th</sup> May. This is the same day that our Grade 10s sit for their external interdisciplinary assessment. Grade 10 will be taking their mock inter-disciplinary exam this Wednesday. We wish them the best of luck with this.
