Change in Weather and Uniform

Parent Teacher Conferences

Majlis Al Arabi

This upcoming weekend, November 23rd and 24th, the 4th annual Majlis Al Arabi conference will take place in the Al-Asriyya School. The theme will be "Our Future Unites Us", and the assembly follows the MUN framework, where over 200 delegates will tackle controversial issues related to our region using the Arabic language to express their opinions and ideas. For the past month, our Secretariat Team have been training our students in addition to students from various Madrasati schools on the rules and procedures of this conference. G10 Community Forum

As part of their Service As Action unit, G10s used the power of action research to present their findings on urgent social issues in a community forum this past Thursday. Topics included mental health, female empowerment, refugee crisis, substance abuse, child labour, environmentalism and social security, all explored within a Jordanian context. We were impressed and inspired by the depth of their research, where information was drawn from interviews with experts, surveys, media and much more. The forum culminated with a presentation by our keynote speaker Ms. Samar Dudin, the Regional Director and Head of Programmes for Ruwwad Al Tanmeya, a non-profit community and youth empowerment organisation. She reminded us that we all have the capacity to create change, and today's forum was a great starting point towards just that.
