College & Career Counseling News

Deadlines deadlines.... This week our Counselling office is overflowing with students as they press that final 'submit' button. The two main dates that are approaching are October 16th for all UK med schools as well as Oxford and Cambridge. The date after that is the American early application round of Nov 1st. This year we have the largest group of students (26) who will submit an early application to either UK or US or both. Applying early has its benefits. Students get the work for colleges finished early in the year to focus on the IB and the demands of the Diploma. Also, US applications in the early round tend to have a higher acceptance rate than regular. However, not every student feels ready at this early stage of the year to commit to a college and most prefer to wait a while before they finalize their choices.

Last week we carried out the 'Digital Readiness Check' for the upcoming PSAT test which is scheduled to take place 19th and 30th October. This year Collegeboard have introduced the digital version of the test and the trial we did was to familiarize our G10 and G11 with the process of registration as well as give students access to practice tests. Needless to say, the PSAT is a very important test in English and Mathematics as it provides

students with an identical experience to the regular SAT. SATs will be reintroduced for most colleges in US next year, taking the PSAT seriously and preparing for it is highly recommended for all students.

The month of October is the busiest with University visits. We have been welcoming delegates from all regions and this exposure has helped our students make informed choices. Many have been offering scholarships at their institutions which is opportunities our kids will no doubt benefit from.
