Library News

KG Library

The KG Library has a new lesson format for students. For one library lesson every month, the students will rotate among three activity stations. Students are asked to choose one of the three stations. The first station is the IPAD station where students choose to listen to an online story using Speakaboos. The second station is the puppet show station where they create their own dialogue and act out stories using puppets. The last station is the Arabic reading station where they listen to an exciting story.

The Primary Library has just started off its first 'Author of the Month' for this year. Students will learn about the life and works of funny author **Jon Scieszka**. Being an elementary teacher for 10 years, Scieszka started to write humorous, twisted stories with kids in mind. His first book, published in 1989 with illustrator Lane Smith, was *The True Story Of The Three Little Pigs*, told from the point of view of Al, the wolf who laments his "big bad" reputation. ("Hey, it's not my fault wolves eat cute little animals like bunnies, and sheep and pigs," Al says. "That's just the way we are. If cheeseburgers were cute, folks would probably think you were big and bad, too.") They will enjoy a great selection of his books like the *Time Warp Trio* series, *Frank Einstein* series and many picture books. It's going to be a fun week!

Makerspaces in the Primary Library

The libraries have finalised their Makerspace dates for the year. Makerspaces are intended to be casual after-school programmes for parents and children to come together and relax while making a product that they are proud of. This year, we will have monthly sign-ups for our Makerspace programme to allow more students to participate. We will have 10 students from KG and 10 from Primary each month. Secondary Library

Arabic in Translation in the Secondary Library

The library loves to encourage students to read Arabic stories in translation because they often compare the translation to the original Arabic and report that the translation can never take the place of the original Arabic because the Arabic language is so much richer. However, we try to bring Arabic in Translation because it supports the demand for more translated work to reach a mass market audience. Understanding stories from other cultures helps students to see situations from other perspectives and encourages empathy, qualities we encourage at IAA. Because of many translation issues, such as the reluctance of publishers to publish in colloquial Arabic, only a handful of children's books have crossed from Arabic to English: House of Anansi published Fatima Sharafeddine's **Faten** as **The Servant** in 2013. Sharafeddine translated the title herself, and it is available in the Secondary Library. Also, Neem Tree Press recently published Ahlam Bsharat's **Ismeel al-Harakee Farasha** as **Code Name: Butterfly**, translated by Nancy Roberts, which will arrive in the Secondary Library sometime in November with our new book order.
