Secondary School News

We hope everyone enjoyed the break and is feeling refreshed for the final months of the school year.

Colour Run and Polio Bake Sale

The last week of school before the break saw student leadership in action. Our Student Council did a wonderful job with the colour run. It was a great success and those who took part helped raise enough money to feed 75 Jordanian families for a whole month. A wonderful gift to give! Our Grade 8 have really engaged with the *End Polio Now* campaign and actively wanted another bake sale in order to purchase even more vaccines. With all the terrible news from Syria and Yemen and danger of Polio becoming established in those two conflict zones again, this is really important work.

MindUP Session for Parents

We are working on the MindUP teaching curriculum and framework with our G6s. The focus is to help our children achieve and maintain focussed attention and encourage mindful action. A representative from MindUP will be presenting a session to our parents (G6-12) on relationships, promoting a healthy dialogue and supporting emotional development of our children. G6 Workshop on Brain Awareness

Brain Awareness Week is a global campaign to promote the benefits of brain research. The official week is in March; however, this Monday a guest speaker will be joining our G6 students. She will present an interactive workshop on how the brain works, neuroplasticity and compare the effects of growth and fixed mindsets on the brain.

G8 Community Project

The Grade 8 students have wrapped up their Community Projects, which encourage them to explore their right and responsibility to implement service as action in their community. They have submitted their process journal extracts, the project plan, the registration form and the signed academic honesty form. They will now

present their projects to each other. Presentations that are strongly communicated and that demonstrate responsible action through learning will be selected to present to all secondary on MYP Day on May 15.

G6-8 Presentation on Drug Awareness

The PTA has invited Dr. Larissa Al-Uar, Co-founder of "Tobacco Free Jordan" and the "LaLitadkhin" NGO, to present to our G6-8 students about psychoactive substances (including alcohol) and drug related risks.

Grade 10 - Revision Weeks

For the next three weeks, the G10s will be revising concepts for the various subjects and linking them with Orientation in Space and Time. In addition, they will be preparing for the "Interdisciplinary Learning" e-assessment, where they have to make connections between Language and Literature with Science, with a focus on natural and human landscapes and resources. The IB has recently published the interdisciplinary pre-release material, which contains background information and sources that students need to understand in order to successfully complete this examination.

Grade 12 – Preparing for Externals

Grade 12s will be in school this week to revise their mock exams with their teachers. Their external examinations will take place from the 27 April to 17 May. We wish our Grade 12s the very best in their preparations and in the examinations.

Bridge Building Competition

Four groups of G8/9 students have put in long hours planning, designing and constructing a bridge out of balsa wood that follows specific criteria. Before the break, all bridges were put to the test as the audience waited impatiently to see the bridge that can withstand the greatest load. It was a close race, but only one bridge carried 6.2kg before it collapsed on the cafeteria floor. The group with the strongest bridge has advanced to the next round, where they will put their bridge-building skills to test as they compete against other schools in Amman on April 21. Congratulations to all of the other participants. We are proud of their efforts and of their bridges.

IELTS testing at IAA

This coming weekend, we host the British Council on campus as they facilitate IELTS testing for our Grade 11 students. By organising it at IAA, we hope to reduce the burden on parents and students in getting this required test in order to be able to meet university and visa requirements for those who wish to study overseas.
