1) Library Resources and Academic Integrity for G6-12 Parents

Service As Action is an integral part of the MYP, where a structured approach is used to integrate service into the curriculum. Students are expected to apply subject matter to develop plans and/or partnerships that meet the needs of others. We will also present on interdisciplinary learning, which takes place between different subject groups to encourage broader perspectives on complex issues and deeper levels of analysis and synthesis of information. Students complete one interdisciplinary unit per semester, which is assessed against the Interdisciplinary assessment criteria. This session is strongly recommended for parents who are new to the MYP and to IAA.

3) eAssessments for G10 Parents

College Counseling News

A few weeks into the semester and the college application process is now well under way. With no time to waste, we've started our work with a number of online applications including UK, US, California and McGill in preparation for early submission. All other applications will soon follow as of when they become available. Students have also been diligently working at finalizing their CVs, which is due on the 19th September. CVs are a culmination of all the work they've been involved in since G9. And although students sometimes feel that there's more that needs to be done, once they begin to document their activities, they'll realize how much was accomplished over the years. We always say include everything because everything matters.

Once students' CVs are completed, we turn our focus to essay writing, which tends to take more time than other components of the application. Students need several drafts to perfect. Every student will receive thorough feedback so there's no need to worry if you feel your child is struggling with their writing.

The early application deadline is Oct 16th – Nov 1st. Students in G12 choose whether they wish to submit an early application or not is based primarily on how well prepared they are. Those who performed well academically at the end of G11 and have utilized their summer break working on projects, entry exams and internships often choose to submit early. Those who feel they need more time to work on their university portfolio usually wait till December to submit. Either way our Counselling office is here to support, guide and facilitate the process to help our students achieve their goals.

The month of September is packed with university visits. Daily we have admission officers come to campus to present to our G12 and G11 to promote their select institutions. We highly recommend for our students to make use of these opportunities and attend the colleges they are interested in. Alternatively, if they are unsure where to apply, they can attend theses sessions to learn about the options available.

Although it is a very busy time of year for us at the Counselling office, I would like to reiterate that we have an open-door policy to help those who feel lost, overwhelmed or who simply want to chat.

Whole School

Destiny Discover

All 3 libraries use Destiny Discover to search and access library books, eBooks, websites and online resources.

Here they'll find leveled encyclopedia articles, multimedia, primary sources, and other learning resources that support student research and reinforce curriculum standards.

Gale Databases

Gale gives us access to many popular magazines and news sources like The New York Times and The Economist, in addition to media sources from all over the world for a better global perspective. JSTOR

JSTOR is a digital library of academic journals, books, and primary sources.

Discuss with your child the benefits of using the credible and trustworthy library sources and help them explore the different options available. By incorporating these resources into their daily routines, students will strengthen their research skills and deepen their understanding.
